March 8th, 2022; the City of Midwest City received 4 bids for the Council Chamber and Bathroom Remodeling Project. Of the bids, Downey Contracting was the lowest and best bid. On March 22nd, 2022 City Council reviewed the bid and awarded the project to Downey Contracting in the amount of \$668,000. Included in the award were alternates to update light fixtures in the chamber, add a generator circuit, and renovate the downstairs bathroom. This is above and beyond the base bid of renovating the Council Chamber and court bathrooms for ADA compatibility. A pre-construction conference was held with Downey Contracting on April 29th, 2022 with discussions regarding schedule and mobilization. As of the writing of this memo we are still waiting on a final schedule. Downey Contracting has been moving forward with selecting materials and ordering; construction is anticipated to start sometime in July 2022.


minimum sidewalk width from 4' to 5'.

At the last ADA Transition Plan Committee meeting November 8, 2021; the committee inquired about the width minimum for City sidewalks. Staff informed them of efforts being done to change the ordinance to require a width of 5' over the current 4'. Since that meeting, the City's Sidewalk Committee met and recommended that we move to a 5' minimum width. As of today, the Ordinance Oversight Committee has seen the following ordinance request but did not take formal action.

City Staff is requesting amendment of the existing ordinance Midwest City code, Chapter 37, Streets and Sidewalks, Article III, Section 37-67, Construction of Sidewalk. During discussion with staff and elected officials; there has been some discussion as to what is the appropriate width of the sidewalk. Currently, the code requires a minimum sidewalk width of 4'.

The 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design are the current federal standard regarding ADA requirements. Sidewalks on public right of way are under the jurisdiction of the Public Rights-of-Way Access Advisory Committee (PROWAG)

- R302.3 Continuous Width: Except as provided in R302.3.1 and R302.3.2, the continuous clear width of pedestrian access routes shall be 4.0 ft minimum, exclusive of the width of the curb.
- R302.4 Passing Spaces: Where the clear width of pedestrian access routes is less than 5.0 ft, passing spaces shall be provided at intervals of 200.0 ft maximum. Passing spaces shall be 5.0 ft minimum by 5.0 ft minimum. Passing spaces are permitted to overlap pedestrian access routes.



Therefore, our current code does not address the absolute minimum as set that there be passing spaces. To simplify code, staff recommends that the minimum be set at 5' wide. In practice, for the past 8 years, all sidewalks constructed under guidance of Community Development have had a typical 5' wide cross section minimum. Our own ADA Transition Committee has discussed this very issue multiple times. 4' is simply too narrow for anyone to pass a wheelchair. It is also uncomfortable to walk side by side on anything less than 5'.

The updated code will bring the City into compliance with this standard. In addition to the revisions from ADA, we propose deleting the existing exhibit which is covered in depth by our construction standards as well as deleting the paragraphs related to grandfathering current subdivisions. When this ordinance was originally passed in 1986, sidewalks were not standard practice; since that time, all subdivisions and commercial are required to have sidewalks unless waived by Council. As such, the old paragraphs related to the original passing need to be deleted to eliminate confusion.
