
Discussion and consideration of reviewing the results of the community questionnaire



Q1 Were you aware that MWC solid waste customers can drop off items for free four times each year at our Transfer Station?





Q2 Would you prefer to keep the free Transfer Station Drop Off option or have periodic curbside collection of bulky items at your home for an additional fee each month?





Q3 How much per month would you be willing to pay to have the convenience of curbside pick up of household bulky items in front of your home?









Q6 How long have you lived in Midwest City? (Please choose years from drop down menu)





Why not offer both for those who may not be able to the station? (elderly, disabled, or just don't have a truck to take things to station)



Since MWC has within the last year or two raised the sales tax to the highest in the region, passed a bond issue and raised the fees on our monthly services bill, I vote for \$0 additional charge for bulky trash. I would, however, agree to a small fee if and when I request a bulky trash pick-up.

Stipulations please. So you can tax us more?

Not everyone has ability to take big items to transfer station. I vote for at least 2 big trash pick ups a year.

Doesn't OKC have big trash day every month?
