1.Discussion and consideration of finding that the following constitute sufficient grounds to establish the need for calling and holding this emergency meeting: on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared COVID-19 a national emergency; and on March 15, 2020 the Governor of the State of Oklahoma declared an emergency caused by the impending threat of COVID-19 to the people of this state and the public's peace, health and safety; all 77 of Oklahoma's counties were included in the state of emergency; the State of Emergency Operations Plan has been activated, and resources of all state departments and agencies available to meet the emergency are committed to the reasonable extent necessary to prepare for and respond to COVID-19 and to protect the health and safety of the public within the State of Oklahoma; preventive measures require action by the City as establishments are not voluntarily complying with CDC recommendations.

- 2. Discussion and consideration of an ordinance amending the Midwest City Municipal Code, Chapter 5, Article I In General, adding 5-1 Emergency operating hours and procedures for food establishments and providing for repealer, severability and declaring an emergency.

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

SECTION 1. The Midwest City Municipal Code, Chapter 5, Article I In General, Section 5-1

REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

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follows:

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37 38 Sec. 5-1. – Emergency Operating Hours and Procedures for Food Establishments.

Emergency Operating Hours and Procedures for Food Establishments is hereby added as

- During the course of the State of Emergency declared by the City of Midwest City on March 16, 2020, until April 12, 2020 unless extended or reduced by the City of Midwest City's City Manager, all bars and similar venues without on-premises food must close from 12:00 p.m. on March 20, 2020 through April 12, 2020.
- All bars and similar venues with on-premises food, may serve take-out or delivery food, or pre-packaged alcohol authorized for sale under state law, from 12:00 p.m. March 20, 2020 through April 12, 2020. They must otherwise remain closed to everyone but employees.
- Dine in services for food products shall be limited to every other table in the establishment of only up to six seated at each table and with CLOSED FOR SERVICE signs clearly indicating which tables are so designated set up on each table not being used for dine in service, in order to preserve the recommended public distancing guidelines issued by the CDC. Each table being served food products should be six feet apart, and with sufficient space at each table for the party being seated to distance themselves while being served.
- The "dine-in", "carry out" and "delivery" services shall be allowed to continue operating during the State of Emergency declared on March 16, 2020 unless state or federal guidelines indicate otherwise.
- The owner and/or operator of any establishment upon which premises any of the violations of this subsection occurs will be in violation for allowing such offense to occur upon the premises and shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$200.00 and may have its municipal license or permit revoked or suspended for a period of time up to one (1) year. Any patrons or staff present may also be cited for any violations of this subsection and shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$200.00 for each such violation.
