Subject: Discussion and Consideration of an Ordinance amending the Midwest City

Municipal Code, Chapter 11, City Emergency Management, Section 11-3 Emergency Operating hours and procedures for Commercial Enterprises;

providing for repealer, severability and declaring an emergency.

The City of Midwest City has continued to address the issues raised by COVID-19 and the changing recommendations on public health controls. On March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared COVID-19 a national emergency and ordered each state to set up emergency operations centers and ordered hospitals to activate their emergency preparedness plans; then on the 15th of March, 2020 the State of Oklahoma declared an emergency caused by the impending threat of COVID-19 to the people of this state and the public's peace, health and safety, and all 77 of Oklahoma's counties were included in the declaration.

On April 22, 2020 Governor Stitt held a press conference where the Governor's Open Up and Recover Safely (OURS) Plan was outlined. On April 24, 2020 the Governor's Office released the Fourth Amended Executive Order 2020-13 addressing the requirements of his OURS Plan. That action necessitated the Proclamation issued by the City's City Manager on April 23, 2020 amending the dates that this Ordinance is in effect for certain businesses from April 30 to April 23, 2020. There are details regarding safety measures to be taken by businesses in categories that will necessitate customer contact that the City wishes to clarify in its ordinance that are not specifically set out in the OURS Plan. These include the use of masks, gloves and other precautions to control the spread of COVID-19 by businesses that have close contact with customers.

The City wants to insure that public health measures are enforceable and to that end has chosen to enact ordinances to address the public health measures the City is taking under the authority granted under Title 63 Oklahoma Statutes Section 683.3, the Oklahoma Emergency Act of 2003.

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#### **ORDINANCE NO. 3406**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MIDWEST CITY MUNICIPAL CODE, CHAPTER 11, CITY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT, SECTION 11-3 EMERGENCY OPERATING HOURS AND PROCEDURES FOR COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF THE CITY OF MIDWEST CITY, OKLAHOMA:

#### **EMERGENCY ORDINANCE**

**SECTION 1.** The Midwest City Municipal Code, Chapter 11, City Emergency Management, Section 11-3 Emergency Operating Hours and Procedures for Commercial Enterprises is hereby added as follows:

# Sec. -1. – Emergency Operating Hours and Procedures for Food Establishments.

- 1. During the course of the State of Emergency declared by the City of Midwest City on March 16, 2020, all businesses should comply with the requirements of this section through April 30, 2020, unless said time period is extended or reduced by the City of Midwest City's City Manager or designee until the City Manager declares that the State of Emergency has ended for the City of Midwest City.
- 2. All bars and similar venues with on-premises food, may serve take out or delivery food, or pre-packaged alcohol authorized for sale under state law, from 12:00 p.m. March 20, 2020 through April 30, 2020 unless said time period is extended or reduced by the City of Midwest City's City Manager or designee. They must otherwise remain closed to everyone but employees The City of Midwest City shall be implementing the Governor's "Open Up and Recover Safely (OURS)" plan which was implemented by the Governor's Order of April 24, 2020.
- 3. Dine in services for food products shall no longer be made available. Food service may only be provided for "carry out" and "delivery" services from 12:00 p.m. March 25, 2020 to April 30, 2020 unless said time period is extended or reduced by the City of Midwest City's City Manager or designeeAll personal care service businesses allowed to reopen on April 24, 2020 under the OURS plan shall implement the safety guidelines for employees and customers outlined in the OURS plan as well as require employees to wear masks and gloves when interacting with customers and other employees. When other personal care businesses, dining facilities and other non-essential businesses which are allowed to reopen on or around May 1, 2020 in the OURS plan, those businesses shall implement the safety guidelines set out in the OURS plan and also be required to have employees wear gloves and masks while interacting with customers and fellow employees. Other non-essential businesses and activities allowed to resume on or around May 15, 2020 in the OURS plan, shall also follow the safety guidelines set

40	out in the OURS plan and require employees to wear masks and gloves when interactions occur		
41	between other employees and customers.		
42	4. All personal services, such as hair salons, gyms, theaters, massage parlors, tattoo parlors,		
43	and museums are ordered to be closed by 11:59 pm March 25, 2020 to April 30, 2020, unless		
44	said time period is extended or reduced by the City of Midwest City's City Manager or designee		
45	Only commercial enterprises that meet the definition of essential services as defined by the		
46	Governor of Oklahoma's Order of March 24, 2020, and thus meet the criteria to remain open		
47	during the City's State of Emergency after March 24, 2020, shall ensure that CDC		
48	recommendations on public distancing, of no less than 6 feet, are complied with through		
49	measures to distance customers in line, customers being served, and among employees providing		
50	these services. The opening dates listed above, and the safety criteria for the businesses set out		
51	for each date, may be modified as needed by the City Manager or his designee.		
52	5. The owner and/or operator of any establishment upon which premises any of the		
53	violations of this subsection-ordinance occurs will be in violation for allowing such offense to		
54	occur upon the premises and shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$200.00 and may have its		
55	municipal license or permit revoked or suspended for a period of time up to one (1) year. Any		
56	patrons or staff present may also be cited for any violations of this subsection and shall be fined		
57	an amount not to exceed \$200.00 for each such violation.		
58	6. The above restrictions shall not apply to blood drives held by the American Red Cross or		
59	Oklahoma Blood Institute provided social distancing practices are implemented to the maximum		
60	extent practicable in the administration of such drives.		
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62	<b>SECTION 2.</b> REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are		
63	hereby repealed.		
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65	<b>SECTION 3.</b> SEVERABILITY. If any section, sentence, clause or portion of this ordinance is		
66	for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining		
67	portions of the ordinance.

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# Sec. -1. – Emergency Operating Hours and Procedures for Food Establishments.

- During the course of the State of Emergency declared by the City of Midwest City on March 16, 2020, all businesses should comply with the requirements of this section until the City Manager declares that the State of Emergency has ended for the City of Midwest City.

- All personal care service businesses allowed to reopen on April 24, 2020 under the OURS plan shall implement the safety guidelines for employees and customers outlined in the OURS plan as well as require employees to wear masks and gloves when interacting with customers and other employees. When other personal care businesses, dining facilities and other non-essential businesses which are allowed to reopen on or around May 1, 2020 in the OURS plan, those businesses shall implement the safety guidelines set out in the OURS plan and also be required to have employees wear gloves and masks while interacting with customers and fellow employees. Other non-essential businesses and activities allowed to resume on or around May 15, 2020 in the OURS plan, shall also follow the safety guidelines set out in the OURS plan and require employees to wear masks and gloves when interactions occur between other employees and customers. 4 The opening dates listed above, and the safety criteria for the businesses set out for each date, may be modified as needed by the City Manager or his designee.
- The owner and/or operator of any establishment upon which premises any of the violations of this ordinance occurs will be in violation for allowing such offense to occur upon the premises and shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$200.00 and may have its municipal license or permit revoked or suspended for a period of time up to one (1) year. Any patrons or staff present may also be cited for any violations of this subsection and shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$200.00 for each such violation.
