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Agreement Articles

Article I - USA PATRIOT Act of 2001

Recipients must comply with requirements of Section 817 of the Uniting and Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism Act of 2001 (USA PATRIOT Act), Pub. L. No. 107-56, which amends 18 U.S.C. sections 175-175c.

Article II - Universal Identifier and System of Award Management

Recipients are required to comply with the requirements set forth in the government-wide financial assistance award term regarding the System for Award Management and Universal Identifier Requirements located at 2 C.F.R. Part 25, Appendix A, the full text of which is incorporated here by reference.



Grantor agrees that Grantees will not maintain, repair or replace Grantor's improvements, including but not limited to fencing, landscaping, sprinklers, pools, sheds, mailboxes, driveways and parking areas whenever it becomes necessary to move or remove improvements, due to any operation, maintenance, replacement, expansion, or repair of the Utility Systems.
- 4. This Permanent Easement does not create an obligation upon the Grantees to construct the Utility Systems, or provide services or functions. Once the Utility System is constructed the Grantees agree to operate, maintain, replace, expand, or repair the Utility System in accordance with Grantees' standards and policies.
- 5. The Grantees do not own the creek, river, lake, detention pond, drainage canal, if any, on or adjacent to the Subject Property and are not legally responsible nor does this Permanent Easement create an obligation upon the Grantees for changes, alterations and modifications to any part or parts of the Subject Property described herein, in the past, present or future, which may be affected in any manner by any change or changes in the course of the creek or waterway, by any accretion or erosion, or evulsion, or alluvion or combination thereof, touching or concerning any part of said Subject Property.

Federal funds were granted through the federal Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) to construct a trail from the still under construction Palmer Loop Trail to the Midwest City Elementary School. This includes a signalized pedestrian crossing of Midwest Boulevard. This project has been under design since being tentatively awarded the funds in 2014.

There was a previous agreement done for this project but ODOT has since requested the passing of an updated agreement. Bidding is currently scheduled for May 2022. The attached agreement is the ODOT template which references design 33345(05), right-of-way 33345(06), and utilities 33345(07). Those portions were completed with City funds in order to receive the construction funding.

The federal funds are not expected to provide the full amount of the project. The remaining City match is partially funded as project #062205 and additional funds will be transferred from project #231907.

Staff recommends approval.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, The Sponsor requested that certain street improvements be approved by the Oklahoma Transportation Commission, as were previously programmed by the Sponsor and described as follows:

WHEREAS, the Department is, by terms of agreements with the Federal Highway Administration, responsible for the management and construction of certain federally funded projects within the corporate limits of cities within the State of Oklahoma; and,

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has been identified as the beneficiary and sub-recipient of such federally funded project; and,

WHEREAS, receipt of the benefits of this project will require that the Sponsor assume certain financial responsibilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Sponsor is a municipal corporation created and existing under the constitution and laws of the State of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, the laws and constitution of the State of Oklahoma impose financial restrictions on the Sponsor and its ability to ensure financial obligations; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto recognize those financial limitations and agree that the financial obligations assumed by the Sponsor, by the terms of this Agreement, are enforceable only to the extent as may be allowed by law or as may be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, it is understood that, by virtue of the Article 10, Section 26 of the Oklahoma Constitution, the payment of Sponsor funds in the future will be limited to appropriations and available funds in the then current Sponsor fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE: the Department and the Sponsor, in consideration of the mutual covenants and stipulations as set forth herein, do mutually promise and agree as follows:

- 1.2 The Sponsor agrees to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. § 252, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d et seq., and all requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21 "Nondiscrimination in federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act 1964".
- 1.3 The DEPARTMENT and SPONSOR mutually recognize that each party is a governmental entity subject to the provisions of the Governmental Tort Claims Act (51 O.S. § 151 et seq.). The DEPARTMENT and SPONSOR hereby mutually agree that each is and may be held severally liable for any and all claims, demands, and suits in law or equity, of any nature whatsoever, paying for damages or otherwise, arising from any negligent act or omission of any of their respective employees, agents or contractors which may occur during the prosecution or performance of this Agreement to the extent provided in the Governmental Tort Claims Act. Each party agrees to severally bear all costs of investigation and defense of claims arising under the Governmental Tort Claims Act and any judgments which may be rendered in such cause to the limits provided by law. Nothing in this section shall be interpreted or construed to waive any legal defense which may be available to a party or any exemption, limitation or exception which may be provided by the Governmental Tort Claims Act.

1.4 The Sponsor understands that should it fail to fulfill its responsibilities under this Agreement, such a failure will disqualify the Sponsor from future Federal-aid funding participation on any proposed project. Federal-aid funds are to be withheld until such a time as an engineering staff, satisfactory to the Department has been properly established and functioning, the deficiencies in regulations have been corrected or the improvements to be constructed under this Agreement are brought to a satisfactory condition of maintenance.

SECTION 2: ENGINEERING RESPONSIBILITIES

- 2.1 The Sponsor shall provide professional engineering services for the development of the Plans, Specifications and Estimates (PS&E) for this project. Design engineering for this project will be performed under the supervision of the Sponsor. Sponsor warrants to the Department that they will review the plans and will certify that the plans are acceptable to the Sponsor and are in full compliance with current standards and specifications.
- 2.2 Progress payments will be made to the consultant by the DEPARTMENT upon receipt of a properly executed claim form, approved by the SPONSOR, accompanied by suitable evidence of the completion of the work claimed, as detailed in the engineering contract.
- 2.3 The SPONSOR agrees to hold the Federal Government and the DEPARTMENT harmless from, and shall process and defend at its own expense, all claims, demands, or suits, whether at law or equity brought against the SPONSOR, the DEPARTMENT, or Federal Government, arising from the SPONSOR's execution, performance, or failure to perform any of the provisions of this Agreement, or arising by reason of the participation of the DEPARTMENT or Federal Government in the project, provided nothing herein shall require the SPONSOR to reimburse the DEPARTMENT or Federal Government for damages arising out of bodily injury to persons or damage to property caused by or resulting from the sole negligence of the Federal Government or the DEPARTMENT.
- 2.4 When any alleged act, omission, negligence, or misconduct may be subject to the limitations, exemptions, or defenses which may be raised under the Governmental Tort Claims Act, 51 0.S. Sec. 151, et seq., all such limitations, exemptions, and defenses shall be available to and may be asserted by the SPONSOR. No liability shall attach to the DEPARTMENT or Federal Government except as expressly provided herein.
- 2.5 The Sponsor agrees to the location of the subject project and agrees to adopt the final plans for said project as the official plans of the Sponsor for the streets,

boulevards, arterial highways and/or other improvements contained therein; and further, the Sponsor affirmatively states that it has or shall fully and completely examine the plans and shall hereby warrant to the Department, the Sponsor's complete satisfaction with these plans and the fitness of the plans to construct aforesaid project.

- 2.6 The Sponsor certifies that the project design plans shall comply, and the project when completed will comply, with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 12213), 49 CFR Parts 27, 37 and 38 and 28 CFR parts 35 and 36. The Sponsor shall be exclusively responsible for integrated ADA compliance planning for all Sponsor streets, sidewalks and other facilities provided for public administration, use and accommodation, which is required of recipients and subrecipients by 49 CFR § 27.11. State highways continued through corporate limits of the Sponsor shall be included in the Sponsor's comprehensive compliance plans.
- 2.7 To the extent permitted by law, all data prepared under this Agreement shall be made available to the Department without restriction or limitation on their further use, with exception of any documents or information that would be considered attorney/client privileged by the Sponsor.
- 2.8 The Department will conduct the environmental studies and prepare the National Environmental Protection Act documents as required for federally funded projects.
- 2.9 The Department will forward the environmental documents to FHWA for approval if applicable.

SECTION 3: LAND ACQUISITION AND UTILITY RELOCATION

- 3.1 The Sponsor warrants to the Department that, they have or will acquire all land, property, or rights-of-way needed for complete implementation of said project, free and clear of all obstructions and encumbrances and in full accordance with the Department's guidelines for Right-of-Way Acquisition on Federal-Aid Projects, the Uniform Relocation Act, the National Environmental Protection Act and all other applicable local, state and federal regulations.
- 3.2 The Sponsor shall be responsible for ensuring all proper tax documentation is filed and issued to recipients of funds paid on behalf of the Sponsor for Right-of-Way acquisition for this project.
- 3.3 The Sponsor warrants to the Department that it is knowledgeable of and will comply with the provisions of 42 U.S.C.A., Section 4601-4655 and 23 U.S.C.A., Section 323 (as

amended) and 49 C.F.R. Part 24 in the acquisition of all right-of-way and the relocation of any displacees.

- 3.4 The Sponsor shall remove, at its own expense, or cause the removal of, all encroachments on existing streets as shown on said plans, including all buildings, porches, fences, gasoline pumps, islands, and tanks, and any other such private installations and shall further remove or remediate any existing environmental contamination of soil and water from any source, known or unknown.
- 3.5 If the acquisition of right-of-way for this project causes the displacement of any person, business or non-profit organization, the Sponsor warrants it will provide and be responsible for the Relocation Assistance Program and all costs associated with the Relocation Assistance Program. The Department, upon request, will provide a list of service providers who have been prequalified to administer the Relocation Assistance Program. The Sponsor agrees to employ a service provider from the prequalified list provided by the Department. Prior to any relocation assistance payments to the Sponsor, all files with parcels requiring relocation assistance shall be submitted to the Department for audit and compliance review. The Sponsor shall notify the Department within seven (7) days of the date of an offer to acquire being provided to a property owner(s) on any parcel which will require relocation assistance. Written notifications regarding service providers, in-house personnel, appeals, offers to acquire or other related correspondence shall be properly addressed and remitted as follows:

- 3.6 The Sponsor warrants that any procurement, using federal funds, of property, goods or professional and personal services required for this project will be acquired by the Sponsor in compliance with the federal procurement Regulations at 40 USC 1101-1104 (Brooks Act) and the Regulations for Administration of Engineering and Design Related Service Contracts at 23 C.F.R. Part 172, as well as provisions of State purchasing laws applicable to the Sponsor.
- 3.7 The Sponsor will certify to the Department prior to establishing a letting date that all existing utility facilities (if any) have been properly adjusted in full accordance with the Department's Right-of-Way and Utilities Division policies and procedures to accommodate the construction of said project; and will be solely responsible for payment of any and all contractor expenses, claims, suits and/or judgments directly resultant from any actual utility relocation delays.

- 3.8 The Sponsor shall have the authority pursuant to 69 O.S. § 1001 and 69 O.S. § 1004 to sell any lands, or interest therein, which were acquired for highway purposes as long as such sale is conducted in accordance with the above cited statutes.
- 3.9 The Sponsor agrees that if any property acquired utilizing Federal funding is disposed of or is no longer used in the public interest the Sponsor shall reimburse the Department at the current fair market value.

3.10 The Sponsor agrees to;

- Transmit copies of the instruments, including all deeds and easements, to the Department prior to the advertisement of bids for construction.
- Comply with the provisions of 42 U.S.C.A. § 4601-4655 and 23 U.S.C.A. § 323 (as amended) and, further comply with 49 C.F.R. Part 24 in the acquisition of all necessary right-of-way and relocation of all displacees.
- Convey title to the State of Oklahoma on all tracts of land acquired in the name of the Sponsor if the project is located on the State Highway System.

SECTION 4: FUNDING SUMMARY

4.1 The Department and the Sponsor agree that the project will be financed at a **not-to-exceed**, ACOG TAP total estimated cost of **\$117,390**, as described below:

4.2 Furthermore, the Department and the Sponsor agree that actual ACOG TAP costs incurred by project phases (JP 31433(04,05) may exceed initial estimates. Costs between these project phases will be administratively adjusted based on actual cost of each phase, within the total cost of this Agreement, without formal supplemental Agreement, in so far as the total project agreement is not exceeded.

4.3 It is understood by the Sponsor and the Department that the funding participation stipulated herein may be altered due to bid prices, actual construction supervision costs and non-participating costs incurred during construction. The Sponsor will be responsible for payment of any estimated local funding prior to advertising the project for bid. Upon final acceptance of this project, the total project cost will be determined, and the final amount of local funds (if any) will be determined by the Department's Comptroller per the terms of this Agreement. A refund will then be made by the Department to the Sponsor or additional funding will be requested. The Sponsor agrees to make arrangements for payment of any Department invoice within 45 days of receipt.

SECTION 5: CONSTRUCTION RESPONSIBILITIES

- 5.1 The Sponsor agrees to comply with all applicable laws and regulations necessary to meet the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ) requirements for pollution prevention including discharges from storm water runoff during the planning and design of this project. Further, the Sponsor agrees and stipulates as stated in the ODEQ's *General Permit OKR10*, dated September 13, 2017 or latest revision, to secure a storm water permit with the ODEQ for utility relocations, when required. It is also agreed that the storm water management plan for the project previously described in the document includes project plans and specifications, required schedules for accomplishing the temporary and permanent erosion control work, the site specific storm water pollution prevention plan and the appropriate location map contained in the utility relocation plans.
- 5.2 The Sponsor's responsibility for environmental cleanup will be a continuing responsibility to remediate any and all known and unknown environmental damage throughout the duration of this agreement with the Department in compliance with State and federal regulations.
- 5.3 The roadway improvements and all devices specified herein shall not be altered, removed, or cease to be operative without mutual written consent of the Department and the Sponsor.
- 5.4 Upon approval of this agreement and the plans, specifications, and estimates by the Sponsor, the Department, and the Federal Highway Administration (if applicable), the Department will advertise and let the construction contract for this project in the usual and customary legal manner. It is agreed that the projects herein contemplated are proposed to be financed as previously described, and that this Agreement, all plans, specifications, estimate of costs, acceptance of work, payments, and procedure in general hereunder are subject in all things at all times to all local, state and federal laws, regulations, orders, approvals as may be applicable hereto.

- 5.5 The Department shall provide a copy of the executed construction contract to the Sponsor, upon receipt of a written request.
- 5.6 The Department will notify the Sponsor of pre-bid dates, bid opening dates, and Transportation Commission award dates in writing upon receipt of a written request.
- 5.7 The Sponsor agrees that prior to the Department's advertising of the project for bids (as to that part of the project lying within the present corporate limits) it will:
 - Grant to the Department and its contractors, the right-of-entry to all existing streets, alleys, and Sponsor owned property when required, and other rights-of-way shown on said plans.
 - Remove at its own expense, or cause the removal of, all encroachments on existing streets as shown on said plans, including all signs, buildings, porches, awnings, porticos, fences, gasoline pumps and islands, and any other such private installations.
 - Prohibit parking on that portion of the project within the corporate limits of the Sponsor, except as may be indicated in the plans or hereafter approved by agreement with the Department. The Sponsor further agrees not to install, or permit to be installed, any signs, signals or markings not in conformance with the standards approved by the Federal Highway Administration and Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).
 - Comply with the Department's standards for construction of driveway entrances from private property to the highway, in accordance with the Department's manual entitled "Policy on Driveway Regulation for Oklahoma Highways", Rev. 5/96, 69 O.S. (2001) § 1210.
 - Maintain all right-of-way acquired for the construction of this project, as shown on said plans, in a manner consistent with applicable statutes, codes, ordinances and regulations of the Department and the State of Oklahoma.
 - Have the authority pursuant to 69 O.S. 2001 § 1001 and 69 O.S. 2001 § 1004 to sell any lands, or interest therein, which were acquired for highway purposes as long as such sale is conducted in accordance with the above cited statutes. Prior written approval by the Chief, Right-of-Way Division for the Department shall be required before any sale is made.

- 5.8 The Sponsor further agrees and warrants to the Department that, subsequent to the construction of said project, the Sponsor will:
 - 1) Erect, maintain and operate traffic control devices, including signals, signs and pavement markings only in accordance with 47 O.S. 2011 §§ 15-104- 15-106, and subject to agreement of the Department:
 - a) In the event that any traffic signal installed hereunder is no longer needed for the purposes designated herein, then the traffic signal installed hereunder shall not be moved by the Sponsor to any other point other than that which is approved by the Department prior to such removal.
 - b) In the event there is no mutually agreed location for the reinstallation, the Sponsor will assume complete ownership of the equipment following removal, if the installation is ten (10) years old or older. If the installation is less than ten (10) years old and:
 - In the event the Sponsor desires total ownership of the equipment, the Sponsor shall reimburse the Department the original federal funding percentage share for the original equipment cost only, amortized for a ten(10) year service life, interest ignored, and assuming straight line depreciation.
 - 2) In the event the Sponsor does not desire total ownership of the equipment, the Sponsor shall sell the equipment at public auction to the highest bidder. The Sponsor shall reimburse the Department the original federal funding percentage share of the proceeds of such sale.
 - 2) Subject to agreement with the Department, regulate and control traffic on said project, including but not limited to, the speed of vehicles, parking, stopping and turns only in accordance with 47 O.S. 2011 §§ 15-104- 15-106, and to make no changes in the provisions thereof without the approval of the Department. It shall be the responsibility of the Sponsor to notify the Department of any changes necessary to ensure safety to the traveling public.
 - 3) Maintain all drainage systems and facilities constructed, installed, modified or repaired in conjunction with this project or as may be otherwise necessary to ensure proper drainage for road surfaces constructed under the terms of this agreement.

- 4) Maintain all curbs and driveways abutting road surfaces constructed under the terms of this Agreement and all sidewalks adjacent thereto.
- 5) Maintain all right-of-way areas adjacent to road surfaces, including erosion control and periodic mowing of vegetation, in a manner consistent with applicable codes, ordinances and regulations.
- 6) For any portion of the project encompassed under this Agreement that is part of the State Highway System, the Sponsor shall maintain all that part of said project within the corporate limits of the Sponsor between the gutter lines and the rightof-way lines, and if no gutter exists, between the shoulder lines and the right-ofway lines, including storm sewers, all underground facilities, curbs and mowing, all in accordance with 69 O.S. Supp. 1994 §901 and all other applicable law.
- 7) On limited access highways where county roads or city streets extend over or under the highway or public roads are constructed on state rights-of-way but there is no immediate ingress and egress from the highway, responsibility shall be as follows:
 - a. The public roads as defined in OAC 730:35-1-2 shall be maintained by the city or county and shall be included in their roadway mileage inventory.
 - b. Where county roads or city streets extend over the highway, the roadway, approaches and bridge surfaces, including the deck, shall be maintained by the city or county. The approach guardrail, bridge structure, and highest clearance posting on the structure shall be maintained by the Department.
 - c. Where county roads or city streets extend under the highway, the roadway approaches and advance signing shall be maintained by the city or county. The Department shall maintain the approach guardrail, bridge structure and surface, and the height clearance posting on the structure.
- 5.9 The Sponsor further agrees and warrants to the Department concerning any sign and highway facility lighting included as part of this project:
 - 1) The Sponsor will, upon notice from the Department Engineer, provide at its own expense all required electrical energy necessary for all preliminary and operational tests of the highway lighting facilities.

- 2) Upon completion of the construction of said project, the Sponsor will be responsible for the maintenance and cost of operation of these highway lighting facilities, including all appurtenances thereto and including the sign lighting facilities.
- 3) It is specifically understood and agreed that the highway lighting and sign lighting facilities specified hereunder shall be continuously operated during the hours of darkness, between sunset and sunrise, and shall not be altered, removed or be allowed to cease operation without the mutual written consent of the Department and the Sponsor.
- 4) The Sponsor agrees to provide, on a periodic schedule, an inspection, cleaning and re-lamping maintenance program to assure the maximum efficiency of the highway lighting facilities.
- 5) In the event that the highway lighting facilities installed hereunder are no longer needed for the purposes designated herein, then the highway lighting facilities installed hereunder shall not be moved by the Sponsor to any point other than which is approved by the Department prior to such removal.
- 6) In the event there is no mutually agreed location for reinstallation, the Sponsor will assume complete ownership of the equipment following removal if the installation is twenty (20) years old or older. If the installation is less than twenty years old and:
 - a) In the event the Sponsor desires total ownership of the equipment, the Sponsor shall reimburse the Department the original federal funding percentage share of the original equipment costs only, amortized for a twenty (20) year service life, interest ignored, and assuming straight line depreciation.
 - b) In the event the Sponsor does not desire total ownership of the equipment, the Sponsor shall sell the equipment at public auction to the highest bidder. The Sponsor shall reimburse the Department the original federal funding percentage share of the proceeds of such sale.
- 5.10 The Department will appoint competent supervision and inspection of the construction work performed by the construction contractor and will provide such engineering, inspection and testing services as may be required to ensure that the construction of the project is accomplished in accordance with the approved Plans,

Specifications and Estimates. The Department reserves the right to make such changes in said plans as may be necessary for the proper construction of said project.

- 1) The Sponsor agrees to provide such competent supervision as the Sponsor deems necessary during times that the work is in progress to ensure the completion of the project to the Sponsor's satisfaction and the Sponsor's representatives and the Department's representatives will cooperate fully to the end of obtaining work strictly in accordance with the plans and specifications.
- 2) The Sponsor will make ample provisions annually for the proper maintenance of said project, including the provision of competent personnel and adequate equipment, specifically, to provide all required maintenance of the project during the critical period immediately following construction and to keep the facility in good and safe condition for the benefit of the traveling public.
- 3) The Sponsor warrants to the Department that it will periodically review the adequacy of the aforesaid project to ensure the safety of the traveling public and should the Sponsor determine that further modifications or improvements be required, the Sponsor shall take such actions as are necessary to make such modifications or improvement. When operation modifications are required which in the opinion of the Department exceed the capability of the Sponsor's staff, the Sponsor agrees to retain, at the sole expense of the Sponsor, competent personnel for the purpose of bringing the improvement up to the proper standard of operation.
- 4) The Sponsor warrants and agrees that upon completion of the aforesaid project, the Sponsor assumes any and all financial obligations for the operation, use, and maintenance of the aforesaid project.

SECTION 6: NON-DISCRIMINATION CLAUSE

1. During the performance of this agreement, the Sponsor, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest, agrees as follows:

1) Compliance with Regulations:

The Sponsor shall comply with the regulations relative to nondiscrimination in federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, as they may be amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this agreement.

2) Nondiscrimination:

The Sponsor, with regard to the work performed by it during the agreement, shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, sex, age, national origin, disability/handicap, or income status, in the selection and retention of contractors or subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. The Sponsor shall not participate either directly or indirectly, in the discrimination prohibited by Section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices when the contract covers a program set forth in appendix B of the Regulations.

3) <u>Solicitations for Subcontracts, Including Procurement of Materials and</u> Equipment:

In all solicitations, either by competitive bidding or negotiation, made by the Sponsor for work to be performed under a contract or subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment, each potential contractor or subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the Sponsor of the Sponsor's obligations under this agreement and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, sex, age, national origin, disability/handicap, or income status.

4) Information and Reports:

The Sponsor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations, or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information and its facilities as may be determined by the State Department of Transportation or the Federal Highway Administration to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations or directives. Where any information required of a Sponsor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the Sponsor shall so certify to the State Department of Transportation, or the Federal Highway Administration, as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.

5) Sanctions for Noncompliance:

In the event of the Sponsor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this agreement, the State Department of Transportation shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the Federal Highway Administration may determine to be appropriate, including but not limited to:

- a. Withholding of payments to the Sponsor under the agreement until the Sponsor complies and/or
- b. Cancellation, termination, or suspension of the agreement in whole or in part.

6) <u>Incorporation of Provisions:</u>

The Sponsor shall include the provisions of sub paragraphs 1) through 5) in every contract or subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto. The Sponsor shall take such action with respect to any contract or subcontract or procurement as the State Department of Transportation or the Federal Highway Administration may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance provided, however, that in the event a Sponsor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation by a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the Sponsor may request the State Department of Transportation to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the State; and, in addition, the Sponsor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

SECTION 7: TERMINATION

- 7.1 This Agreement may be terminated by any of the following conditions:
 - a) By mutual agreement and consent, in writing of both parties.
 - b) By the Department by written notice to the Sponsor as a consequence of failure by the Sponsor to perform the services set forth herein in a satisfactory manner.
 - c) By either party, upon the failure of the other party to fulfill its obligations as set forth herein.
 - d) By the Department for reasons of its own and not subject to the mutual consent of the Sponsor upon five (5) days written notice to the Sponsor.
 - e) By satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein.
- 7.2 The termination of this Agreement shall extinguish all rights, duties, obligations and liabilities of the Department and the Sponsor under this agreement. If the potential termination of this Agreement is due to the failure of either the Department or the Sponsor to fulfill their obligation as set forth herein, the non-breaching party will notify the party alleged to be in breach that possible breach of agreement has occurred. The party alleged to be in breach should make a good faith effort to remedy that breach as outlined by non-breaching party within a period mutually agreed by each party.

SECTION 8: GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE

8.1 Any claims, disputes or litigation relating to the solicitation, execution, interpretation, performance, or enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Oklahoma and the applicable rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the Oklahoma Transportation Commission. Venue for any action, claim, dispute or litigation, mediation or arbitration shall be in Oklahoma County, Oklahoma.

SECTION 9: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

9.1 The parties hereto have entered into this agreement in the State of Oklahoma and the laws of the State of Oklahoma shall apply. The parties agree to bargain in good faith in direct negotiation to achieve resolutions of any dispute and, if such efforts are unsuccessful, to retain a neutral mediation service to mediate the dispute prior to the filing of any court action. Mediation shall be conducted in the Oklahoma City area and the costs of such mediation shall be borne equally by the parties. If mediation is not successful, venue for any action brought to enforce the terms of this agreement shall be in Oklahoma County, State of Oklahoma. Each party shall bear any cost and attorney fees incurred by the party in such litigation.

SECTION 10: PRIOR UNDERSTANDINGS

10.1 This agreement incorporates and reduces to writing all prior understandings, promises, agreements, commitments, covenants or conditions and constitutes the full and complete understanding and contractual relationship of the parties.

of change order #3 amending the contract with Shiloh Enterprises, Inc. to construct the WP Bill Atkinson Park in an increased amount of \$103,887.57

and to add 55 additional days of time.

The attached change order is for the construction of the WP Bill Atkinson Park. This change order is a culmination of various field changes.

COR#08 – ASI #2 lighting changes, \$7,552.60, 10 days. This is to correct an issue in the plans which did not adequately address the up lighting of the hanger structure.

COR#09 – Dry Pipe Sprinkler, \$94,960.45, 45 days. At bidding, it was realized that the hanger structure would need a fire suppression system. Since the system will be exposed to elements, a dry pipe type was requested. This is a culmination of not only the sprinkler system itself but also the required improvements inside the structure to accommodate the system such as walls, lighting, door, electrical, etc.

COR#14-4" bollards in lieu of 6" bollards, -\$2,080.00. The original specification for the manual retractable bollards were for 6" diameter which are not manufactured. The contractor has proposed going with a 4" manual retractable bollards and crediting the difference based on estimated material differences.

COR#15 – Purchase 8 OG&E cages for lighting, \$3,455.12. OG&E is requiring that the City purchase rebar cages for the light pedestals. Shiloh purchased 8 of the cages in efforts to speed up the process and avoid delay. This price is a direct pass through from OG&E.

This will increase the original contract by \$103,887.57, bringing the new contract amount to \$5,237,626.62. The additional 55 delay days will bring the new contract length to 434 total days.

The funding for this project is appropriated in project #9219G1.

Applicant: G & S Sign Services, LLC

SSM Health Oklahoma took over the operation of the Midwest Memorial Hospital in April. Prior to assuming the lease, City Council on February 23, 2021, approved a variance application for G & S Sign Services, LLC that allowed the rebranding of existing signs as well as the addition of new signage on the hospital campus. SSM Health also desired a sign for the Hospital's eastern entrance on National Avenue, but there was no property available for a site.

The Midwest City Memorial Hospital Authority last April acquired the former Chase Bank, 301 N Midwest BL with the intent of eliminating a blighted building and redeveloping the site. This property lies in the Restricted Commercial (C-1) zoning district. SSM approached the Authority about the possibility of erecting a sign on the former bank site, which would require similar variances as before:

• The proposed location is not on SSM's premises and, thus, constitutes an off-premise sign. Section 9-385(x) prohibits off-premise advertising in all zoning districts except for industrial. Variance Requested: To allow the issuance of a permit for an off-premise sign in the Restricted Commercial (C-1) zoning district.

Action is at the discretion of the City Council.

Action Required: Approve or reject the appeal to the sign ordinance for the property described as noted in this staff report.

Executive Summary: In April of 2021, the City Council approved an ordinance to rezone a portion of this property to R-MH-2 to allow for additional mobile homes to be placed on the property in the future. During those hearings, concerns were brought up by surrounding property owners regarding drainage. The zoning was approved contingent upon the applicant/owner submitting a plat application with a site development plan and drainage plan prior to expanding. This application does include a drainage plan which is further discussed in the engineering portion of this report. The applicant has also submitted a Tree Canopy Management Plan. This plat does include all required easements and right-of-way. The drives within the existing development are private and will remain so with any expansion. Tie-on to the public water system and the installation of sidewalk along the frontage will be required. Action is at the discretion of the City Council.



The purpose of a Preliminary Plat shall be to determine the general layout of the subdivision, the adequacy of public facilities needed to serve the intended development, and the overall compliance of the land division with applicable requirements of the Subdivision Ordinance.

History:

- 1. This area was zoned R-4, High Density Residential with the adoption of the 1985 Zoning Map.
- 2. In April 2021 a portion of the property was rezoned to R-MH-2 (PC-2063).
- 3. The Planning Commission recommended approval of this item December 7, 2021.

Engineer's Comments:

Note: This application is for a preliminary plat of Parkway Manufactured Home Community located at 10301 SE 29th Street.

Section 38-18 in the Subdivision Regulations requires all existing and proposed utility lines and public improvements be reflected on the preliminary plat or accompanying plan. The proposed public utility line installations required with this application are shown on the plat, must be constructed and will be dedicated to the city prior to the final plat application.

Water Improvements

An eighteen (18) inch public water main is located along the south side of S.E. 29th Street. Any new building permit or new trailer site will require tie into the public water system as outlined in Municipal Code 43-32. The tie into public water can be either via a master meter and distributed after or the public main extended with individual meters. A public water main would require a dedicated easement. Extension of the public water system will require plans submitted by an Oklahoma licensed engineer to be designed to city standard. Plans will be reviewed by both the City and Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality before being constructed and inspected.


Sanitary Sewerage Collection and Disposal

Two separate eight (8) inch public sanitary sewers are located along the north and east sides of the property. Any new building permit or new trailer site will require tie into the public sewer system as outlined in Municipal Code 43-109. The existing park already has a private collection system which ties into the public sewer main on the northwest corner. Since this property is one lot, there can be additional units on this same tie in point. Alternatively, if the applicant desires extension of the public sewer system; it will require plans submitted by an Oklahoma licensed engineer to be designed to city standard. Plans will be reviewed by both the City and Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality before being constructed and inspected. A public sewer main would require a dedicated easement.

Streets and Sidewalks

Access to the area of request exists off S.E. 29th Street which is classified as a Primary Arterial in the 2008 Comprehensive Plan. A primary arterial requires a total right of way of 120 feet, 60 feet on each side of the centerline with an additional ten (10) foot utility easement adjacent to the proposed development. It will be required to be dedicated on the final plat if not already existing.








Looking north east directly across S.E. 29th Street from the eastern drive identified as "Gayle Drive" towards the eastern side of the parcel.

SE 29th Street is currently two lanes with both existing driveways being approximately 245' apart. The existing driveways will have to be modified according to Sec. 37-65(b) of the municipal code, specifically case 5;

37-65(b).... Where property on which multi-family dwellings, commercial, industrial and/or institutional buildings are being developed, and where driveways or streets from said property to the major arterial street are being constructed at more than one hundred (100) feet apart, improve the existing major street in order that such major street will provide a twentyfive (25) foot traffic lane across each intersecting street or driveway from such property as measured between the center line and the right-of-way line of the major street, plus a transitional section of pavement on each side of the intersecting streets or driveways for a distance of two (2) times the width of the widening as shown on the drawing following this section as Case 5.



There is no sidewalk across the frontage of SE 29th Street. Sidewalk construction will be required prior to final platting since this is one lot, one block. Any work to the existing drives or sidewalk will require current Midwest City standard.

Improvement plans for the street and sidewalks must be prepared by a registered professional engineer and be submitted to staff for plan review and approval.

The applicant proposes to construct local access within the property to access the future sites. Because this property is remaining one lot / one block, it will remain as one owner and is being considered similar to that of an apartment complex etc. which typically uses parking lots and private drives to serve internal units. If this property were ever to be subdivided, improvements would be required to bring the access up to City standard in width, construction, and dedication.

Improvement plans for the street and sidewalks must be prepared by a registered professional engineer and be submitted to staff for plan review and approval.

The comprehensive plan dictates the connection of internal streets within the square mile sections that are designated as future collector roads. The thoroughfare plan does not designate this area to contain a future collector road.

Drainage and Flood Control, Wetlands, and Sediment Control

The proposed development grading falls to the northwest towards Soldier Creek Tributary 6. There are no developed storm systems on the property other than a few areas where it was graded to drain. The existing development has a few inlets and swales which discharges onto the undeveloped portion of the property.



There is a raised abandoned railroad forming a berm which runs roughly running east west across the northern portion of the property. This berm restricts the storm water from crossing to the north in any place other than a large concrete box culvert. Drainage to the proposed development generally is as follows:

- The applicant has proposed a common detention pond to handle all the drainage caused by the impervious surfaces on site. The outfall comprised of 2 24" pipes would be upstream of the large concrete box culvert.
- Offsite runoff from the east is proposed to flow through the development and flow through the large concrete box culvert.
- Offsite runoff on the north side of the berm would be addressed with the developer as stated in an email 11/19/2021: "Construction of a grass swale (along)(sp) their eastern edge in a public drainage and trail easement... and... will transition the grass swale into a concrete channel at the transition point to the existing flume". The constructed grass swale will be covered by a Private Drainage Easement and maintenance will be the responsibility of the property owner. This area has been of a particular concern by the neighbors along Alicia Drive, immediately on the north. If designed properly, the efforts by the developer should mitigate the concerns of the neighbors. The developer and the neighbors should take the opportunity to discuss future maintenance and develop a communication channel on which to voice future concerns.

The area of request is shown to be in an "Area of Minimal Flood Hazard" meaning no floodplain on two Flood Insurance Rate maps (FIRM) which bisect the property.

- The northern section of the property is on map number 40109C0330H, dated December 18th, 2009.
- The southern section of the property is on map number 40109C0340H, dated December 18th, 2009.

The National Wetlands Inventory, www.fws.gov/wetlands/data/Mapper.html prepared by the United States Department of the Interior Fish and Wildlife Service, accessed November 22nd, 2021, shows two separate freshwater ponds, a 1.02 acre classified as PAB4Hx and a 0.10 acre classified as PUSCh. Any development of the parcel will need appropriate permitting and/or documentation from the Army Corps of Engineers.

All future development on the proposed tracts must conform to the applicable requirements of Municipal Code Chapter 13, "Drainage and Flood Control." Resolution 84-20 requires that developers install and maintain sediment and/or erosion controls in conjunction with their construction activities. Any proposed development must conform to the applicable requirements of Municipal Code Chapter 43, "Erosion Control."

Sediment control plans must be submitted to and approved by the city before any land disturbance is done on-site. The developer is responsible for the cleanup of sediment and other debris from drainage pipes, ditches, streets and abutting properties as a result of his activities.

Easements and Right-of-Way

The required easements and existing right of way for the area of request are illustrated on the preliminary plat and will be dedicated to the city when the final plat is filed. All easements and right of way dedications are to comply with Municipal Code Sections 38-43, 38-44, and 38-45.

Fire Marshal's Comments: The property is required to meet and maintain the requirements of Midwest City

Ordinances Section 15. Fire hydrants and fire mains are required to be installed in accordance with Midwest City Ordinance Section 15 and the International Fire Code through the proposed new addition of the site. Hydrant placement will be reviewed, coordinated and approved through line maintenance and the Fire Marshal's office. The cul-de-sac shown on the plat is not the correct size. Minimum cul-de-sac size shall be 96 feet in diameter. Minimum road width shall be 26 feet.

Planning Comments:

The purpose of this preliminary plat is to further develop the plot for the use of mobile homes. The developer intends to build a detention pond for the purpose of mitigating the runoff from the additional coverage caused by the additional homes.

Staff determined that a Park Land Review Committee hearing was not necessary as the purpose of this plat is to address concerns with drainage and there is an existing park area with a basketball court and swimming pool in the mobile home community. With this in mind, additional park land dedication is not necessary.

The applicant has submitted a Tree Canopy Management Plan. Staff has reviewed the plan and found it to meet the ordinance.

Further development of this lot is conforming to its current use and does not violate any tenet or principle of the comprehensive plan.

Action Required: Approve or reject the preliminary plat of Parkway located on the property as noted herein, subject to the staff comments and found in the January 25, 2022 agenda packet and made a part of PC- 2102 file.

ENGINEERING STAFF CODE CITATIONS AND COMMENTS - PC-2102:

Note: This application is for a preliminary plat of Parkway Manufactured Home Community located at 10301 SE 29th Street.

Section 38-18 in the Subdivision Regulations requires all existing and proposed utility lines and public improvements be reflected on the preliminary plat or accompanying plan. The proposed public utility line installations required with this application are shown on the plat, must be constructed and will be dedicated to the city prior to the final plat application.

Water Improvements

An eighteen (18) inch public water main is located along the south side of S.E. 29th Street. Any new building permit or new trailer site will require tie into the public water system as outlined in Municipal Code 43-32. The tie into public water can be either via a master meter and distributed after or the public main extended with individual meters. A public water main would require a dedicated easement. Extension of the public water system will require plans submitted by an Oklahoma licensed engineer to be designed to city standard. Plans will be reviewed by both the City and Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality before being constructed and inspected.

Sanitary Sewerage Collection and Disposal


Two separate eight (8) inch public sanitary sewers are located along the north and east sides of the property. Any new building permit or new trailer site will require tie into the public sewer system as outlined in Municipal Code 43-109. The existing park already has a private collection system which ties into the public sewer main on the northwest corner. Since this property is one lot, there can be additional units on this same tie in point. Alternatively, if the applicant desires extension of the public sewer system; it will require plans submitted by an Oklahoma licensed engineer to be designed to city standard. Plans will be reviewed by both the City and Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality before being constructed and inspected. A public sewer main would require a dedicated easement.

Streets and Sidewalks

Access to the area of request exists off S.E. 29th Street which is classified as a Primary Arterial in the 2008 Comprehensive Plan. A primary arterial requires a total right of way of 120 feet, 60 feet on each side of the centerline with an additional ten (10) foot utility easement adjacent to the proposed

development. It will be required to be dedicated on the final plat if not already existing.








Looking north east directly across S.E. 29th Street from the eastern drive identified as "Gayle Drive" towards the eastern side of the parcel.

SE 29th Street is currently two lanes with both existing driveways being approximately 245' apart. The existing driveways will have to be modified according to Sec. 37-65(b) of the municipal code, specifically case 5;

37-65(b)....Where property on which multi-family dwellings, commercial, industrial and/or institutional buildings are being developed, and where driveways or streets from said property to the major arterial street are being constructed at more than one hundred (100) feet apart, improve the existing major street in order that such major street will provide a twenty-five (25) foot traffic lane across each intersecting street or driveway from such property as measured between the center line and the right-of-way line of the major street, plus a transitional section of pavement on each side of the intersecting streets or driveways for a distance of two (2) times the width of the widening as shown on the drawing following this section as Case 5.



There is no sidewalk across the frontage of SE 29th Street. Sidewalk construction will be required prior to final platting since this is one lot, one block. Any work to the existing drives or sidewalk will require current Midwest City standard.

Improvement plans for the street and sidewalks must be prepared by a registered professional engineer and be submitted to staff for plan review and approval.

The applicant proposes to construct local access within the property to access the future sites. Because this property is remaining one lot / one block, it will remain as one owner and is being considered similar to that of an apartment complex etc. which typically uses parking lots and private drives to serve internal units. If this property were ever to be subdivided, improvements would be required to bring the access up to City standard in width, construction, and dedication.

Improvement plans for the street and sidewalks must be prepared by a registered professional engineer and be submitted to staff for plan review and approval.

The comprehensive plan dictates the connection of internal streets within the square mile sections that are designated as future collector roads. The thoroughfare plan does not designate this area to contain a future collector road.

Drainage and Flood Control, Wetlands, and Sediment Control

The proposed development grading falls to the northwest towards Soldier Creek Tributary 6. There are no developed storm systems on the property other than a few areas where it was graded to drain. The existing development has a few inlets and swales which discharges onto the undeveloped portion of the property.



There is a raised abandoned railroad forming a berm which runs roughly running east west across the

northern portion of the property. This berm restricts the storm water from crossing to the north in any place other than a large concrete box culvert. Drainage to the proposed development generally is as follows:

- The applicant has proposed a common detention pond to handle all the drainage caused by the impervious surfaces on site. The outfall comprised of 2 24" pipes would be upstream of the large concrete box culvert.
- Offsite runoff from the east is proposed to flow through the development and flow through the large concrete box culvert.
- Offsite runoff on the north side of the berm would be addressed with the developer as stated in an email 11/19/2021: "Construction of a grass swale (along)(sp) their eastern edge in a public drainage and trail easement... and... will transition the grass swale into a concrete channel at the transition point to the existing flume". The constructed grass swale will be covered by a Private Drainage Easement and maintenance will be the responsibility of the property owner. This area has been of a particular concern by the neighbors along Alicia Drive, immediately on the north. If designed properly, the efforts by the developer should mitigate the concerns of the neighbors. The developer and the neighbors should take the opportunity to discuss future maintenance and develop a communication channel on which to voice future concerns.

The area of request is shown to be in an "Area of Minimal Flood Hazard" meaning no floodplain on two Flood Insurance Rate maps (FIRM) which bisect the property.

- The northern section of the property is on map number 40109C0330H, dated December 18th, 2009.
- The southern section of the property is on map number 40109C0340H, dated December 18th, 2009.

The National Wetlands Inventory, <u>www.fws.gov/wetlands/data/Mapper.html</u> prepared by the United States Department of the Interior Fish and Wildlife Service, accessed November 22nd, 2021, shows two separate freshwater ponds, a 1.02 acre classified as PAB4Hx and a 0.10 acre classified as PUSCh. Any development of the parcel will need appropriate permitting and/or documentation from the Army Corps of Engineers.

All future development on the proposed tracts must conform to the applicable requirements of Municipal Code Chapter 13, "Drainage and Flood Control." Resolution 84-20 requires that developers install and maintain sediment and/or erosion controls in conjunction with their construction activities. Any

proposed development must conform to the applicable requirements of Municipal Code Chapter 43, "Erosion Control." Sediment control plans must be submitted to and approved by the city before any land disturbance is done on-site. The developer is responsible for the cleanup of sediment and other debris from drainage pipes, ditches, streets and abutting properties as a result of his activities.

Easements and Right-of-Way

The required easements and existing right of way for the area of request are illustrated on the preliminary plat and will be dedicated to the city when the final plat is filed.

All easements and right of way dedications are to comply with Municipal Code Sections 38-43, 38-44, and 38-45.

of accepting the **updated** Traffic Signal Study and analysis for the intersection of S.E. 15th Street and Windsong Drive and approving the Traffic and Safety Commission's

recommendation of denial for a signal installation.

The applicants, the residents and the HOA of the Windsong Addition, appeared before the City Council on January 26th, 2021 requesting the City investigate the installation of a traffic signal at the intersection of S.E. 15th Street and Windsong Drive. The City entered into a contract with T.E.C. (Traffic Engineering Consultants) to do an evaluation of the intersection seeing if met the minimum requirements as stated by the MUTCD. A proposed signal project must meet these minimum requirements to be eligible for funding through the A.C.O.G. T.I.P. Safety Project funding program. The intersection does not meet those requirements at this time. The summary letter from T.E.C. and the full report are attached as part of this application.

This does not disqualify the possibility of installing a signal at a future date.

This item was originally heard at the September Traffic and Safety Commission meeting and the September 28th City Council meeting. The City Council noted that the 2020 and 2021 accident counts were not part of the report. Therefore, the City Council asked that those records be incorporated into the reports. They then asked for the updated studies to be re-heard by the Traffic and Safety Commission and then brought back to be heard again by the City Council. MWC PD provided printouts of those accident records which were then incorporated into an updated traffic study. The additional data did not change the results of the study. The Traffic and Safety Commission met October 21st, 2021 reaffirming their September vote to forward the study to City Council with the following recommendation:

The intersection does not qualify for a federal safety project grant, the Traffic and Safety Commission voted to follow the Traffic Signal Analysis findings and recommends denial of a signal project for the intersection at this time.

The City Council also requested speed tables for the intersection, they are included as part of this item.

Action to follow the study's findings and deny the request for a signal is at the discretion of the council.



INTRODUCTION

Traffic Engineering Consultants, Inc. (TEC) was contracted by the City of Midwest City to conduct a traffic signal warrant analysis on the intersection of SE 15th Street and Windsong Drive in Midwest City, Oklahoma as shown in **Figure 1** in **Appendix A**. The intersection is currently unsignalized with northbound and southbound stop control. SE 15th Street is a four-lane east/west major arterial with a posted speed limit of 45 mph. Windsong Drive is a two-lane north/south collector street with a posted speed limit of 25 mph. There is a single-family house located north of the intersection. The house driveway is located opposite Windsong Drive and would need to be included in any potential traffic control modifications.

TRAFFIC DATA




FIGURE 2. 2021 Existing Traffic S.E. 15th St. and Windsong Dr.

Twenty-four hour turning movement volume counts were collected at the study intersection in August of 2021 while school was in session. The traffic volume data indicated that the a.m. peak hour occurred from 7:00 - 8:00 and the p.m. peak hour occurred from 4:45 - 5:45. The 2021 existing traffic volumes are summarized in **Figure 2** and detailed printouts of all the traffic count data are included in **Appendix B**.

The 24-hour approach volumes collected on each leg of the intersection are as follows:

SE 15th Street west of Windsong Drive = 6,275 vpd
 SE 15th Street east of Windsong Drive = 5,332 vpd
 Windsong Drive south of SE 15th Street = 977 vpd

CRASH DATA

The crash history was evaluated at the intersection of SE 15th Street and Windsong Drive utilizing the ODOT SAFE-T: Statewide Analysis for Engineering & Technology database. The previous 8 years of crash data was collected from January 1, 2014 - September 28, 2021. The 2018-2021 data were noted that it may be incomplete and, as a precaution, the 2020 and 2021 SAFE-T crash data was not included in the evaluation. Alternatively, the Midwest City Police Department provided up-to-date collision data through September 28, 2021, from which the 2020 and 2021 collision data was extracted.

The data indicated 2 collisions in 2014, 1 collision in 2015, 1 collision in 2016, 0 collisions in 2017, 0 collisions in 2018, 0 collisions in 2019, 0 collisions in 2020, and 0 collisions in 2021. Typically, five or more collisions at an intersection within a 12-month period indicates there may be a correctable safety issue. Based on this information, the intersection would not warrant the need for a traffic signal solely based on collision data. Detailed printouts of the crash data are included in **Appendix B**.

WARRANT ANALYSIS

To determine the need for traffic control modifications at the intersection of SE 15th Street and Windsong Drive, a traffic signal warrant analysis was conducted. The analysis was conducted using *PC-Warrants 2* which is a software package for evaluating intersections to support the installation of a multiway stop or traffic signal in accordance with the *Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD)*. This publication is a federally approved publication which governs the traffic engineering practices across the country. The MUTCD has eight sets of thresholds or "warrants" that may be evaluated at an intersection to determine whether a traffic signal should be considered to reduce accidents or delay. If one of the warrants is met the installation of a traffic signal should be considered.

The eight-hour vehicular volume, four-hour volume, peak hour, and crash experience warrants were evaluated to determine if the intersection would warrant the installation of a traffic signal. The intersection was evaluated utilizing the 2021 existing traffic volumes with existing intersection geometry. Following is a summary of the results:

SE 15th Street and Windsong Drive

- Warrant 1 Eight Hour Vehicular Volumes Not Satisfied
 - Warrant 1A Minimum Vehicular Volume Not Satisfied (required volumes reached for 0 hours, 8 are needed)
 - Warrant 1B Interruption of Continuous Traffic Not Satisfied (required volumes reached for 0 hours, 8 are needed)
 - Warrant 1C Combination of Warrants Not Satisfied (required 1A volumes reached for 0 hours, 8 are needed) (required 1B volumes reached for 1 hours, 8 are needed)
- Warrant 2 Four Hour Volumes Not Satisfied (required volumes reached for 0 hours; 4 are needed)
- Warrant 3B Peak Hour Volumes Not Satisfied (required volumes reached for 0 hours; 1 is needed)
- Warrant 7 Crash Experience Not Satisfied
 (0 collisions in the previous 12 months; 5 are needed)

The results indicated that the intersection of SE 15th Street and Windsong Drive does not come close to satisfying any traffic signal warrants under the 2021 existing traffic volumes. Detailed printouts of the worksheets are included in **Appendix C**.

SUMMARY

The intersection of SE 15th Street and Windsong Drive does not currently satisfy eight-hour vehicular volume, four-hour volume, peak hour, or crash experience warrants under the 2021 existing traffic data. The intersection would not be expected to satisfy any of the vehicular volume warrants in the near future. Based on the results of the analysis, the installation of a traffic signal is not recommended at the intersection of SE 15th Street and Windsong Drive at this time.



SE 15th Street and Windsong Drive

On Oct 21, 2021 I attended the Traffic Safety agenda meeting at 6:00PM. During the meeting, the discussion was about putting a traffic signal light at NE 10th and Shadybrook. My understanding is the complaint consist of speeders on NE 10th and it is causing accidents. The engineer Brandon Bundy stated that the purpose of traffic signal lights are not to control speed. Mr. Bundy also presented a survey that had speeds listed and from his report speed was not a factor. There were a few speeds in the 60MPH in the 40MPH zone. Mr Bundy explained the few excessive speeds they had could of been emergency personnel. The records dept pulled all accidents that were on NE 10th from N. Air Depot to N. Midwest Blvd and there were no accidents at NE 10th and Shadybrook.

My observation from running traffic in the area: I did observe several vehicles driving 45MPH to 50 MPH. The traffic in the area during mid day is very thick, which makes it hard to do excessive speed. I believe most of the crashes come from the hill terrain in the area. I feel if a traffic signal light is placed there we could possibly increase crashes due to the amount of traffic backing up from the red light and as cars come over the hill at 40MPH to 45MPH we have crashes. I have looked through several crash reports we took from NE 10 st and majority of the crashes are just people not paying attention when they pull onto NE 10th from a side street and the collision occurs, not related to speed. There were a couple rear enders from someone trying to turn from NE 10 onto a side street and getting struck from behind. My solution to the area would be to add a center turn lane, so that frees up the cars trying to make the left hand turn. The left hand turn lane also allows traffic to continue to flow east and westbound.

SE 15th and Windsong:

Another topic was a traffic signal at SE 15th and Windsong for speeders. Once again it was presented at the meeting that a traffic light is not designated for speeders. I pulled crashes in that area and there wasn't an overwhelming amount of crashes. I have personally ran traffic in the area on SE 15th st from Westminster to S. Post RD. The only time I can get any activity on speed is from about 3:30PM to about 6:00PM. Most of my speeding tickets are people traveling around 57MPH to 60MPH. From that time frame of 3:30PM to 6:00PM or even 7:00PM i can write about 5-7 tickets for speeding.

My solution for SE 15th street is: I continue to work ASAP in the area and also use my daily patrols. I think it will eventually slow people down over a short period of time. Thanks Shuck.

RESOLUTION NO.	

A RESOLUTION APPOINTING THOSE PERSONS DESIGNATED BY TAXING JURISDICTIONS TO THE "MIDWEST CITY LOCAL DEVELOPMENT ACT REVIEW COMMITTEE".

WHEREAS, certain areas within the City of Midwest City, Oklahoma have experienced economic stagnation or decline in recent years due to a lack of adequate public infrastructure serving such area; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Midwest City desires to reverse such economic stagnation, to expand or retain the number of persons currently employed within such area, to attract significant new private investment into such area, and to preserve or enhance the tax base of such area; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Midwest City has determined that public improvements are necessary in order to accomplish the above-stated objectives; and

WHEREAS, Section 6C of the Oklahoma Constitution, along with the "Local Development Act", codified as Title 62, Section 850 et seq. of the Oklahoma Statutes (the "Oklahoma Local Development Act"), authorizes cities, towns and counties to adopt incentives for the development or redevelopment of such areas, and empowers the governing bodies of cities, towns or counties to apportion tax increments to help finance the public costs of such development or redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Midwest City Council, as the governing body of the City of Midwest City, Oklahoma, has previously adopted Resolution No. <u>21-48</u> declaring the intent of the City Council to consider the creation of a tax increment district, and, as required by law, establishing a review committee in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Local Development Act requires that the membership of such review committee include "a representative designated by each taxing jurisdiction within the proposed district whose ad valorem taxes might be impacted"; and

WHEREAS, each taxing jurisdiction within the proposed district has now designated a representative to serve on the Midwest City Local Development Act Review Committee.

Date: January 25, 2022

The proposed amendment to Section 9-2 of the City of Midwest City municipal code will update these provisions and bring them into compliance with Oklahoma State Law at Title 11 O.S. Sec. 22-111 and 22-112. These provisions concern when the City can take action on dilapidated buildings and unsecured buildings. The amendments bring the city ordinance requirements in line with state law. These proposed amendments:

- Bring the notice requirements in line with state law.
- Allow the City Manager to delegate duties to an administrative body, in line with state law.
- Expand the definition of dilapidated building to be in line with state law.
- Align the process for notification of an unsecured building to make it the same as a dilapidated building.

Approval is at the pleasure of the City Council. There is an emergency clause added to this ordinance amendment to have the changes to go into effect immediately. There will need to be two votes on this ordinance amendment, the first vote to approve the amendments and the second vote to approve the emergency.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MIDWEST CITY MUNICIPAL CODE, CHAPTER 9
BUILDINGS AND BUILDING REGULATIONS, ARTICLE I, IN GENERAL, SECTION 9-2,
DILAPIDATED BUILDINGS; AND PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SEVERABILITY AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIDWEST CITY, OKLAHOMA:

ORDINANCE

<u>Section 1.</u> That the Midwest City Municipal Code, Chapter 9 Buildings and Building Regulations, Article I, In General, Section 9-2, Dilapidated buildings; is hereby amended to read as follows:

The city council may cause dilapidated buildings within the municipal limits to be torn down and removed in accordance with the provisions as follows:

(a) At least fifteen (15) days (10) days notice that a building is to be torn down or removed shall be given to the owner of the property before the city council takes action or holds a hearing. A copy of the notice shall be posted on the property to be affected. In addition, a copy of the notice shall be sent by certified mail with return receipt requested to the property owner at the address shown by the current year's tax rolls in the office of the county treasurer. Written notice shall also be mailed to the mortgage holder as shown by the records in the office of the county clerk to the last-known address of the mortgagee. At the time of mailing of notice to any property owner or mortgage holder, the municipality shall obtain a receipt of mailing from the postal service, which receipt shall indicate the date of mailing and the name and address of the mailee. However, if neither the property owner nor mortgage holder can be located, notice may be given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Midwest City. If notice is given by publication, such notice shall be published once not less than ten (10) days prior to any hearing or action pursuant to the provisions of this section, or in the alternative, notice may be given by first-class mail to the property owner and mortgage holder. The city at its option may, during the time period for mailing by certified mail, publish the notice as required above.

(b) A hearing may shall be held by the city council to determine if the property is dilapidated and has become detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the general public and the community, or if said property creates a fire hazard which is dangerous to other property.

(c) Pursuant to a finding that the condition of the property constitutes a detriment or a hazard and that the property would be benefitted by the removal of such conditions, the city council may cause and order the dilapidated building to be torn down and removed. The city council shall fix reasonable dates for the commencement and completion of the work. The building official, or his the building official's designees, or code enforcement, as assigned by the City Manager are granted the right of entry on the property for the performance of the necessary duties as a governmental function of the City of Midwest City if the work is not performed by the property owner within the dates fixed by the governing body. If the city performs the work

or causes the work to be done, then the city clerk shall immediately, upon completion of the work, file a notice of lien with the county clerk describing the property, the findings of the city council at the hearing, and stating that the City of Midwest City claims a lien on said property for the destruction and removal costs. Any action to challenge the order of the city council shall be filed within thirty (30) business days from the date of the order.

(d) The city council shall determine the actual cost of the dismantling and removal of the dilapidated buildings and any other expenses that may be necessary in conjunction with the dismantling and removal of the buildings, including the cost of notice and mailing. The city clerk shall forward a statement of the actual cost attributable to the dismantling and removal of the buildings and a demand for payment of such costs, by eertified mail with return receipt requested to the property owner. In addition, a copy of the statement shall be mailed to any Mortgage holder at the address provided for in paragraph (a) of this section. If the City of Midwest City dismantles or removes any dilapidated buildings, the cost to the property owner shall not exceed the actual cost of the labor, maintenance, and equipment required for the dismantling and removal of the dilapidated buildings is done on a private contract basis, the contract shall be awarded to the lowest and best bidder.

When payment is made to the City of Midwest City for costs incurred, the city clerk shall (e) file a release of lien; but if payment attributable to the actual cost of the dismantling and removal of the buildings is not made within six (6) months from the date of the mailing of the statement to the owner of such property, the city clerk shall forward a certified statement of the amount of the cost to the county treasurer of the county in which the property is located. The costs shall be levied on the property and collected by the county treasurer as are other taxes authorized by law. The costs and the interest thereon shall be the personal obligation of the property owner from and after the date of the notice of dilapidation and lien is filed with the county clerk. The cost and the interest thereon shall be a lien against the property from the date the notice of the lien is filed with the county clerk. The lien shall be co-equal with the lien of ad valorem taxes and all other taxes and special assessments and shall be prior and superior to all other titles and liens against the property. The lien shall continue until the cost is fully paid. At any time prior to collection as provided for in this paragraph, the City of Midwest City may pursue any civil remedy for collection of the amount owing and interest thereon. Upon receiving payment, the city clerk shall forward to the county treasurer a notice of such payment and shall direct discharge of the lien.

(f) The city manager shall may designate the building official or code enforcement to carry out the duties of the city council specified in this section. The property owner shall have the right to appeal to the city council from any order of the building official or code enforcement. Such appeal shall be taken by filing a written notice of appeal with the city clerk within ten (10) days after the administrative order of the building official or his designees is rendered. If said appeal is not taken within ten (10) days as provided, the order shall be final and the costs of the action shall be determined as provided.

(g) For the purposes of this section;

(1) "dilapidated <u>Dilapidated</u> building" means:

1	(A) a structure which through neglect or injury lacks necessary repairs or
2	otherwise is in a state of decay or partial ruin to such an extent that the structure is a
3	hazard to the health, safety, or welfare of the general public;

In making such determination, the city council shall apply the following standard: The city council may order the boarding and securing of the unsecured building when the boarding and securing thereof would make such building less available for transient occupation, decrease a fire hazard ereated by such building, or decrease the hazard that such building would constitute an attractive nuisance to children. Upon making the required determination, the city council may order the boarding and securing of the unsecured building.
- (4) After the city council orders the boarding and securing of such unsecured building, the city clerk shall immediately file a notice of lien with the county clerk describing the property, stating the findings of the city council at the hearing at which such building was determined to be unsecured, and stating that the municipality claims a lien on said property for the costs of boarding and securing such building.
- (5) Pursuant to the order of the city council, the building official and/or his designees are granted the right of entry on the property for the performance of the boarding and securing of such building and for the performance of all necessary duties as a governmental function of the municipality.
- (6) After an unsecured building has been boarded and secured, the city council shall determine the actual costs of such actions and any other expenses that may be necessary in conjunction therewith. The city clerk shall forward a statement of the unsecured building and a demand for payment of such costs, by certified mail with return receipt requested to any property owners and mortgage holders as provided in this section. If the City of Midwest City boards and secures any unsecured building, the cost to the property owner shall not exceed the actual cost of the labor, materials and equipment required for the performance of such actions. If such actions are done on a private contract basis, the contract shall be awarded to the lowest and best bidder.
- (7) When payment is made to the City of Midwest City for costs incurred, the city clerk shall file a release of lien, but if payment attributable to the actual costs of the boarding and securing of the unsecured building is not made within thirty (30) days from the date of the mailing of the statement to the owner of such property, the city clerk shall forward a certified statement of the amount of the costs to the county treasurer of the county in which the property is located. The costs shall be levied on the property and collected by the county treasurer as are other taxes authorized by law. The costs and interest thereon shall be a lien against the property from the date the notice of lien is filed with the county clerk. The lien shall be co-equal with the lien of ad valorem taxes and all other taxes and special assessments and shall be prior and

superior to all other titles and liens against the property. The lien shall continue until the costs and interest are fully paid. At any time prior to collection as provided for in this paragraph, the City of Midwest City may pursue any civil remedy for collection of the amount owing and interest thereon. Upon receiving payment, the city clerk shall forward to the county treasurer a notice of such payment and shall direct discharge of the lien.

At the time of each such summary boarding and securing, the city shall notify the property owner and mortgage holder of the boarding and securing and the costs thereof. The notice shall state that the property owner may request an appeal with the city clerk within ten (10) days after the mailing of the notice. The notice and hearing shall be as provided for in subsection (k)(1) of this section. Unless otherwise determined at the hearing the cost of such boarding and securing shall be determined and collected as provided for in subsections (k)(6) and (k)(7) of this subsection.

(10) A governing body of any municipality may determine that a building is unsecured and order that such building be boarded and secured in the manner provided for in this subsection even though such building has not been declared by the governing body, to be dilapidated.

(11) For the purposes of this subsection:

a. Board and securing or boarded and secured means the closing, boarding or locking of any or all exterior openings so as to prevent entry into the structure; and

b. *Unsecured building* shall mean any structure which is not occupied by a legal or equitable owner thereof, or by a lessee of a legal or equitable owner, and into which there are one (1) or more unsecured openings such as broken windows, unlocked windows, broken doors, unlocked doors, holes in exterior walls, holes in the roof, broken basement or cellar hatchways, unlocked basement or cellar hatchways or other similar unsecured openings which would facilitate an unauthorized entry into the structure.

(l) The officers, employees or agents of the city shall not be liable for any damages or loss of property due to the removal of dilapidated buildings performed pursuant to the provisions of this section or as otherwise prescribed by law.

Section 1. That the Midwest City Municipal Code, Chapter 9 Buildings and Building Regulations, Article I, In General, Section 9-2, Dilapidated buildings; is hereby amended to read as follows:

The city council may cause dilapidated buildings within the municipal limits to be torn down and removed in accordance with the provisions as follows:

(a) At least fifteen (10) days notice that a building is to be torn down or removed shall be given to the owner of the property before the city council takes action or holds a hearing. A copy of the notice shall be posted on the property to be affected. In addition, a copy of the notice shall be sent by mail to the property owner at the address shown by the current year's tax rolls in the office of the county treasurer. Written notice shall also be mailed to the mortgage holder as shown by the records in the office of the county clerk to the last-known address of the mortgagee. At the time of mailing of notice to any property owner or mortgage holder, the municipality shall obtain a receipt of mailing from the postal service, which receipt shall indicate the date of mailing and the name and address of the mailee. However, if neither the property owner nor mortgage holder can be located, notice may be given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Midwest City. If notice is given by publication, such notice shall be published once not less than ten (10) days prior to any hearing or action pursuant to the provisions of this section.

(b) A hearing shall be held by the city council to determine if the property is dilapidated and has become detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the general public and the community, or if said property creates a fire hazard which is dangerous to other property.

 (c) Pursuant to a finding that the condition of the property constitutes a detriment or a hazard and that the property would be benefitted by the removal of such conditions, the city council may cause and order the dilapidated building to be torn down and removed. The city council shall fix reasonable dates for the commencement and completion of the work. The building official, the building official's designees, or code enforcement, as assigned by the City Manager are granted the right of entry on the property for the performance of the necessary duties as a governmental function of the City of Midwest City if the work is not performed by the property owner within the dates fixed by the governing body. If the city performs the work or causes the work to be done, then the city clerk shall immediately, upon completion of the work, file a notice of lien with the county clerk describing the property, the findings of the city council at the hearing, and stating that the City of Midwest City claims a lien on said property for the

destruction and removal costs. Any action to challenge the order of the city council shall be filed within thirty (30) business days from the date of the order.

(d) The city council shall determine the actual cost of the dismantling and removal of the dilapidated buildings and any other expenses that may be necessary in conjunction with the dismantling and removal of the buildings, including the cost of notice and mailing. The city clerk shall forward a statement of the actual cost attributable to the dismantling and removal of the buildings and a demand for payment of such costs, by mail to the property owner. In addition, a copy of the statement shall be mailed to any Mortgage holder at the address provided for in paragraph (a) of this section. If the City of Midwest City dismantles or removes any dilapidated buildings, the cost to the property owner shall not exceed the actual cost of the labor, maintenance, and equipment required for the dismantling and removal of the dilapidated buildings. If the dismantling and removal of the dilapidated buildings is done on a private contract basis, the contract shall be awarded to the lowest and best bidder.

When payment is made to the City of Midwest City for costs incurred, the city clerk shall (e) file a release of lien; but if payment attributable to the actual cost of the dismantling and removal of the buildings is not made within six (6) months from the date of the mailing of the statement to the owner of such property, the city clerk shall forward a certified statement of the amount of the cost to the county treasurer of the county in which the property is located. The costs shall be levied on the property and collected by the county treasurer as are other taxes authorized by law. The costs and the interest thereon shall be the personal obligation of the property owner from and after the date of the notice of dilapidation and lien is filed with the county clerk. The cost and the interest thereon shall be a lien against the property from the date the notice of the lien is filed with the county clerk. The lien shall be co-equal with the lien of ad valorem taxes and all other taxes and special assessments and shall be prior and superior to all other titles and liens against the property. The lien shall continue until the cost is fully paid. At any time prior to collection as provided for in this paragraph, the City of Midwest City may pursue any civil remedy for collection of the amount owing and interest thereon. Upon receiving payment, the city clerk shall forward to the county treasurer a notice of such payment and shall direct discharge of the lien.

(f) The city manager may designate the building official or code enforcement to carry out the duties of the city council specified in this section. The property owner shall have the right to appeal to the city council from any order of the building official or code enforcement. Such appeal shall be taken by filing a written notice of appeal with the city clerk within ten (10) days after the administrative order of the building official or his designees is rendered. If said appeal is not taken within ten (10) days as provided, the order shall be final and the costs of the action shall be determined as provided.

(g) For the purposes of this section:

(1) "Dilapidated building" means:

(A) a structure which through neglect or injury lacks necessary repairs or otherwise is in a state of decay or partial ruin to such an extent that the structure is a hazard to the health, safety, or welfare of the general public;

- (B) a structure which is unfit for human occupancy due to the lack of necessary repairs and is considered uninhabitable or is a hazard to the health, safety, and welfare of the general public;
- (C) a structure which is determined by the municipal governing body or administrative officer of the municipal governing body to be an unsecured building, as defined by paragraph (k)(11) of this Section, more than three times within any twelvemonth period;
- (D) a structure which has been boarded and secured, as defined by paragraph (k)(11) of this Section, for more than six (6) consecutive months; or
- (E) a structure declared by the municipal governing body to constitute a public nuisance; and
- (2) Owner means the owner of record as shown by the most current tax rolls of the county treasurer.
- (h) Nothing in the provisions of this section shall prevent the City of Midwest City from abating a dilapidated building as a nuisance or otherwise exercising its police power to protect the health, safety, or welfare of the general public.
- (i) After a building has been declared dilapidated, as provided in this section, and before the commencement of the tearing and removal of a dilapidated building, the city council of the City of Midwest City may authorize that such a building be boarded and secured.
- (j) The city council may cause the premises on which an unsecured building is located to be cleaned of trash and weeds in accordance with the provisions of Article II, Chapter 27.
- (k) The city council may cause an unsecured building to be boarded and secured in accordance with the dilapidated building procedures contained in this Section.

For the purposes of this subsection:

- a. Board and securing or boarded and secured means the closing, boarding or locking of any or all exterior openings so as to prevent entry into the structure; and
- b. *Unsecured building* shall mean any structure which is not occupied by a legal or equitable owner thereof, or by a lessee of a legal or equitable owner, and into which there are one (1) or more unsecured openings such as broken windows, unlocked windows, broken doors, unlocked doors, holes in exterior walls, holes in the roof, broken basement or cellar hatchways, unlocked basement or cellar hatchways or other similar unsecured openings which would facilitate an unauthorized entry into the structure.

SSM Health has a free-standing, off-premise sign in the median on Parklawn Drive at E Reno Avenue that demarks the southern entrance to the Hospital. A second permit for a similar sign has been requested for the eastern entrance at the NW corner of N Midwest Avenue and National Avenue on property now owned by the Authority. As before, the installation of the sign will require a variance.

The proposed agreement allows SSM to lease approximately 13.6 ft.² of our 75,358 ft.² lot for \$1. It also provides the City/Authority liability protection by requiring insurance and indemnification. The agreement carries a 15 year term with additional five year renewals unless SSM opts out of the Hospital Lease, at which time this agreement would terminate.

The approval of this agreement is contingent upon the approval of the necessary zoning variance leading to the issuance of a sign permit.

SIGN LEASE AGREEMENT

Structure Location: 301 N Midwest Boulevard, Midwest City, OK

LESSEE Agrees and hereby promises to Pay the LESSOR a one-time payment in the sum of <u>One Dollar</u> (\$1) PAYABLE IN ADVANCE, and other just consideration. Furthermore, LESSEE agrees to pay all costs associated with the installation of the Sign and installation and connection to electrical service if so desired. LESSEE also agrees to absorb the monthly cost of such electric service to the Sign for the duration of this Agreement.

LESSEE may make additions or deletions to displays at their own expense and agrees to assume all liability for same. Any amendments, alterations or other changes to the Sign must be approved in advance by the LESSOR, who agrees not to unreasonably withhold such approval. LESSEE also agrees to obtain City permits for any such alterations where required and to maintain the sign in good order for the duration of the Agreement. LESSEE shall be responsible for making appropriate repairs to the Sign.

HOLD HARMLESS: The LESSEE AGREES TO SAVE AND HOLD LESSOR AND THE CITY OF MIDWEST CITY HARMLESS from any and all claims or demands because of damage caused by or resulting from any display covered by this agreement. The LESSEE agrees to save and hold LESSOR harmless from any and all liability, claims or demands on account of bodily injury or physical property damage caused by or resulting from any negligent or willful act of the LESSEE with regard to any display, installation or labor authorized by this agreement, specifically including but not limited to any acts with regard to the use of auxiliary advertising panels, pictorial illustrations, changeable copy letters or numerals, or other devises on or to the advertising display(s) herein authorized, or on account of any allegation that the use of any name, picture or other materials in any display authorized by this agreement is illegal, unauthorized or damaging in any way to any person or other legal entity.

The LESSEE agrees to carry at its own expense adequate Public Liability Insurance in an amount of no less than \$1 Million naming the City of Midwest City and the Midwest City Memorial Hospital Authority as additional insured, and covering all such contingencies so long as this Agreement shall remain in effect.

LESSEE FURTHER AGREES TO SAVE THE LESSOR AND THE CITY OF MIDWEST CITY HARMLESS from any and all claims or demands on account of damage caused by or removal of display (or partial removal) resulting from federal, state or city authorities, laws, rules, condemnation, fires, natural disasters, acts of God and vandalism. In the event of any of the aforementioned, LESSOR shall

not charge rental for that period of time after removal of the advertising display. The LESSEE AGREES TO SAVE AND HOLD LESSOR AND THE CITY OF MIDWEST CITY HARMLESS FROM ANY AND ALL CLAIMS OR DEMANDS OR DAMAGES CAUSED BY OR RESULTING FROM AFOREMENTIONED and this lease agreement shall then become null and void.

The City of Midwest City and its trusts are covered by the Oklahoma Tort Claims Act at 51 O.S. Sec. 151 et seq. Any claims for damages against the City of Midwest City or its trusts must be filed and comply with the requirements of the Oklahoma Tort Claims Act.

UNAUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIONS. Neither party hereto shall be bound by any agreement nor is representation, expressed or implied, not contain herein. The LESSEE hereby acknowledges that no representations, agreements, or promises whatsoever have been made to the LESSEE other than those specifically stated herein. This contract is a final and complete agreement between the parties hereto, and may not be modified, supplemented, explained or waived by parole evidence, nor by a course of dealing, nor in any other way except by a modification or change reduced to writing and signed by authorized the LESSEE and LESSOR. Each person signing this contract, on behalf of the respective party represented warrants that it has full authority to do so.

TERMINATION: This Agreement shall remain intact for fifteen (15) years or for the duration of the LESSEE's operation and tenancy of the Midwest City Memorial Hospital, 2825 Parklawn Drive (the "Hospital"), whichever ends first. It shall be renewable in increments of five (5) years thereafter.

It shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and to their respective heirs, successors, administrators, and assigns. The Agreement shall be deemed as "null and void" immediately following the expiration of the Agreement or upon the LESSEE vacating the Hospital or by either party with thirty (30) days advance notice, whichever occurs first.

It shall be the LESSEE's responsibility to remove the Sign and all appurtenances upon termination of the Agreement. The Sign shall become the property of the LESSOR if it is not removed within thirty (30) days following the termination of the Agreement.

ACCEPTANCE of CONTRACT: This contract shall be deemed to have been executed and its terms enforceable only upon the acceptance hereof by LESSOR either by the commencement of performance or by formal written acceptance below. Following such acceptance, it shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and to their respective heirs, successors, administrators, executors and assigns.

The laws of the State of Oklahoma shall be used to interpret this Agreement. Any legal action arising from the contract must be filed in the proper State or Federal Court located in Oklahoma County.

LESSOR reserves the exclusive right to assign their rights pertaining to this lease to heirs, successors, and/or any other third parties. LESSEE agrees not to sublease any portion of the Sign without written approval from the LESSOR.

INVALIDATION of any part of this lease agreement by judgment or court order shall in no way affect any of the other provisions which shall remain in full force and effect. This Agreement, any attachments,

and any future amendments to it shall serve as the total and complete contract between the parties. No terms and conditions that fall outside the contract, attachments to the contract or amendments shall be construed as being a part of the contract.

LOSS. If, during the term of this agreement, the Sign is so damaged by fire or other casualty, not occurring through negligence of LESSEE or its agents, invitees or employees, that the Sign is rendered wholly unfit for use, and if the same is not reasonably expected to be repaired within one hundred eighty (180) days after such damage, this agreement shall terminate, at the option of LESSOR or LESSEE (to be exercised, if at all, within thirty (30) days after the date of such damage, or earlier upon demand of either party), as of the date of such damage, and in such case. If such damage is reasonably expected to be capable of being repaired within one hundred eighty (180) days after the occurrence, then LESSOR may, at its option, (a) terminate this Lease as of the date of such occurrence; or (b) LESSOR may enter upon and repair same without affecting this agreement. If the agreement has not been terminated in accordance with the provisions hereof, and if the Sign is so damaged by such fire or other casualty as not to be rendered wholly unfit for occupancy, LESSOR shall repair same with reasonable promptness.

Convention & Visitors Bureau Activities: Q4 October, November, December 2021

The mission of the Convention & Visitors Bureau is to stimulate Midwest City's economic vitality through tourism by positioning and selling the community in partnership with public and private sectors as a premier destination for conventions, tradeshows, corporate meetings, group tours, and individual leisure travel. The CVB offers assistance with site tours and acquiring bids at our hospitality venues and information on special events, dining, catering, entertainment and local attractions.

In pursuit of its mission, the CVB generates increased visitor spending for the overall business community through creative marketing programs, attractive incentive packages, and special events.

- We continue to see the decline in visitor's guide requests that we experienced in the 3rd
 Quarter. A decrease in travel inquiries due to the holiday season can be anticipated, however,
 due to a resurgence of COVID variants, it seems the travel and tourism industry will continue to
 experience long term effects going into 2022. 252 visitor's guides were requested this quarter
 through the TravelOK and the Convention & Visitors Bureau websites.
- The social markets didn't experience a strong Holiday / Christmas Party season. It is presumed many corporate gatherings were canceled due to a tumultuous year of recovery and individuals catching up with family from the 2020 holiday season.
- Group booking trends continue to look positive for 2022 and into 2023. We will continue to
 monitor the new variants and the effects it will have on a vulnerable travel and tourism
 industry. Additional postponements / cancellations should be expected.
- The CVB continues to participate in virtual and in-person travel & tourism industry events
 hosted by OTIA, OSAE and TravelOK. This assembly of travel and tourism experts provide an
 understanding of the challenges and prospects that destination marketing organizations will
 encounter as the industry moves toward recovery.
- Hotel / Conference Center operators, event planners and destination marketers continue to be optimistic, albeit guarded, as developments regarding COVID variants emerge.
- As anticipated, employing staff in hospitality, food & beverage and hotel services continues to be a major constraint in keeping up with the recovery.
- A full report from the US Travel Association on the Effects of COVID-19 on Travel, Tourism and the US Economy can be found at <u>State of the Workforce | U.S. Travel Association (ustravel.org)</u>
- The CVB and Chamber of Commerce will be partnering to enhance the existing Visitors Guide and Chamber Guide by merging the 2 publications into one resource of Midwest City information. This change was made to keep up with prevailing times of information gathering, cost effectiveness and an increase in relocation package requests. Convention welcome bags, existing fulfillment programs and demand from residents will continue to be realized. By partnering in an all-encompassing "Experience Midwest City" publication, we broaden our overall exposure for our Midwest City businesses and capture the opportunity to highlight the

- amenities of our community through relocation prospects, new business interests and visitor perspectives.
- The Midwest City Chamber of Commerce invited the CVB and the Economic Development Department to participate in a 'spot light' segment of Midwest City for Discover Oklahoma. Brielle's Bistro was the featured location. The episode aired Saturday, December 11, 2021.

We do expect this to bring continued business to Town Center Plaza and surrounding businesses.
- The **Trick or Trail** drive-thru event was moved to the drive path in Regional Park. This proved to be much safer and logistically friendly modification. The unusually warmer weather made for an ideal day for an outdoor community event. The event was a huge success.

2021 Highlights

SPECIAL EVENTS + CVB

Large-Scale Public Events Return to Midwest City:

Covered in Color / Midwest ArtFest formed a stronger partnership to develop an expanded event in 2021. On May 8, 2021, the streets surrounding Charles J. Johnson Park were filled with vendors and visitors, bringing retail traffic and community engagement to Town Center Plaza.

Live entertainment events such as **Tribute to Liberty** and **Rockin' Regional** were well attended and received positive community feedback. Event vendors were very pleased with their ROI.

Family-focused events in Joe B. Barnes Regional Park ensured programming was available for the community between large events. This included free films and family-friendly activities.

Trick or Trail, the Veterans Day Parade and Holiday Lights Spectacular created a very festive fall event season. Trick or Trail visitors + community partners commended the City for such a unique Halloween event. The 2021 Veterans Day Parade ended a 3-year cancelation drought and the route was filled with parade spectators. Holiday Lights Spectacular suffered a few setbacks with damaged, stolen and vandalized equipment, but Public Works staff made quick repairs and brought back this important community event that was managed by Special Events staff. Despite the reduced HLS schedule, visitor numbers/donations exceeded expectations.

CVB also had its fair share of events partnering with the MWC Chamber to host the **Midwest**City Hiring Event. The event filled the Nick Harroz Community Center with community partners and job applicants. Cruise In For Coffee consistently brought in 250+ car enthusiasts to gather monthly between April and October. CVB also lent invaluable support to Special Events throughout the year, most especially during Covered in Color, the Veterans Day Parade and Holiday Lights Spectacular.

COMMUNICATIONS & MARKETING

Special Projects & Enhanced City Service Communication:

A new director joined the CAM team in early March, in time to support the communication efforts for the revised bond project and charter amendment special election in May 2021, as well as the flurry of special events that were scheduled for late spring and summer. Early support was also provided in communicating the SSM Health transition, Emergency Management programs/announcements and Moving Forward General Obligation Bond Project updates.

Events included the **W.P. Bill Atkinson Park Groundbreaking** and **Animal Services Center Grand Opening**, which helped residents and visitors see the value G.O. Bond projects can create in the community. The department is making preparations for planning as many as five successive grand openings regarding these projects in the first half of 2022, as well as the associated media outreach.

Multiple departments in 2021 received graphic design and video production support to help promote their helpful community services. This included a rebranded Resident Request Reporter campaign, video profiles for Community Development projects, video/graphic design/communication support for various Public Works services, graphic design/communication support for Grants Management programs and communication support for Economic Development programs.
